ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT



This past June, the Middle States Commission on Higher Education re-affirmed the accreditation for our Associates, Bachelors and Masters degrees. In addition, SUNY Maritime's Bachelor's degree program in Electrical Engineering, Facilities Engineering, Marine Engineering, Mechanical Engineering and Naval Architecture were accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission of ABET, Inc., the recognized accreditor of college and university programs in applied science, computing, engineering, and technology. ABET accreditation demonstrates a program's commitment to providing its students with a quality education.

SUNY Maritime College successfully passed the US Coast Guard Audit "with flying colors." The audit was conducted jointly between USCG and MARAD. The purpose of the audit was to "determine process effectiveness and compliance with current federal regulations and STCW requirements." Maritime was credited with making "significant improvements to the facilities and engineering simulation and the auditors also noted that "the professionalism, enthusiasm, and cooperative attitude from all faculty, staff, and students were instrumental in making the audit a success." The USCG MARAD audit takes place every five years.

Our faculty continue to serve at the forefront of maritime education. In 2012, faculty have made presentations on their research at national and international conferences. We have reinvigorated our LEAD 101 course that serves as a basic-college-survival course, and as a result, the average GPA of new students increased. The Learning Center and academic advisement programs were renewed.

The Global Maritime Center for Research, Development, Education, and Training was established in the spring of 2012. Under the direction of Dr. Richard Burke, the Center has six areas of concentration: Research and Development; Continuing Education; K-12 Education and Outreach; Leadership and Executive Development; Maritime Homeland Security; Maritime Strategic Conferences.

SUMMER SEA TERM



For the fourth year in a row, due to increased enrollment in the SUNY Maritime College Regiment of Cadet Corps, the College held two 45-day Summer Sea Term sessions aboard the College's training ship, *The Empire State VI*. Second and third class Cadets took part in one of the two 45-day sessions. First class Cadets were on-board for the full 90 days. More than 735 Cadets took part in the Summer Sea Term (19 from Maine Maritime Academy and 50 from Texas A&M), that began on May 9, 2012, and concluded with the ship's return to the College's Olivet Pier on August 6, 2012.

Also over the summer 2012 session, 73 students took part in the College's Cadet Observer program that also saw growth. The Cadet Observer Program provides real-life maritime exposure to further prepare deck and engine students for their USCG Third Mate's, Engineer's, or Limited license in a professional, industry-supported environment, on-board a commercial vessel.

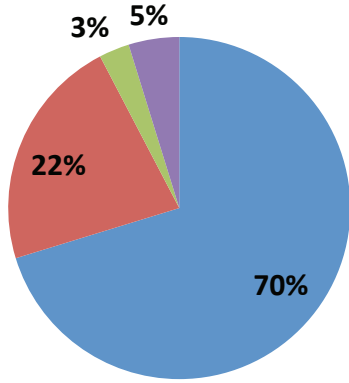
During the first 45-day Summer Sea Term that began on May 9, 2012, *The Empire State VI* made port calls in San Miguel, Azores and Reykjavik, Iceland. Returning after the first session, on June 20, 2012, the *Empire State VI* visited the Port of Norfolk, VA. Cadets from the first Summer Sea Term session changed out and a new group of students boarded the ship for the second session. The ship departed Norfolk on June 23, 2012, and visited the European ports of Gibraltar and Liverpool, England, before returning to the Maritime campus on August 6, 2012. While at sea, the Cadets are kept on a busy schedule learning ship handling, maneuvering, boat training, navigation and leadership.

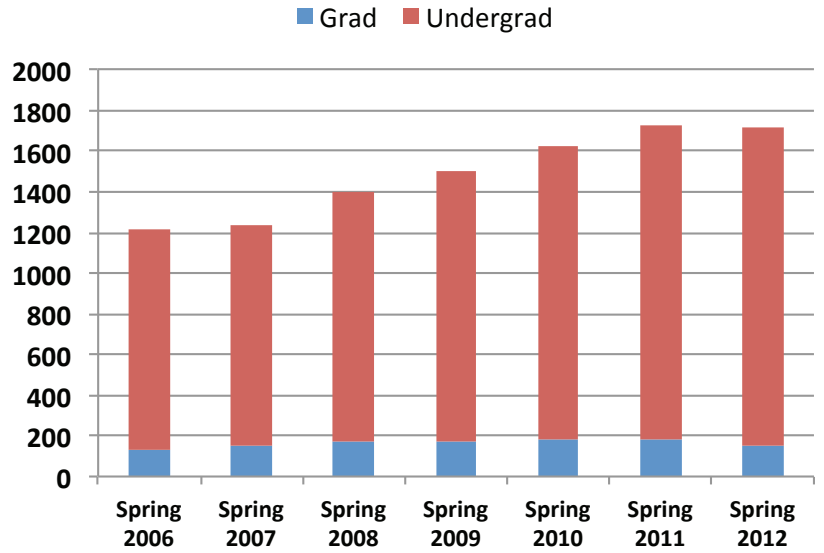

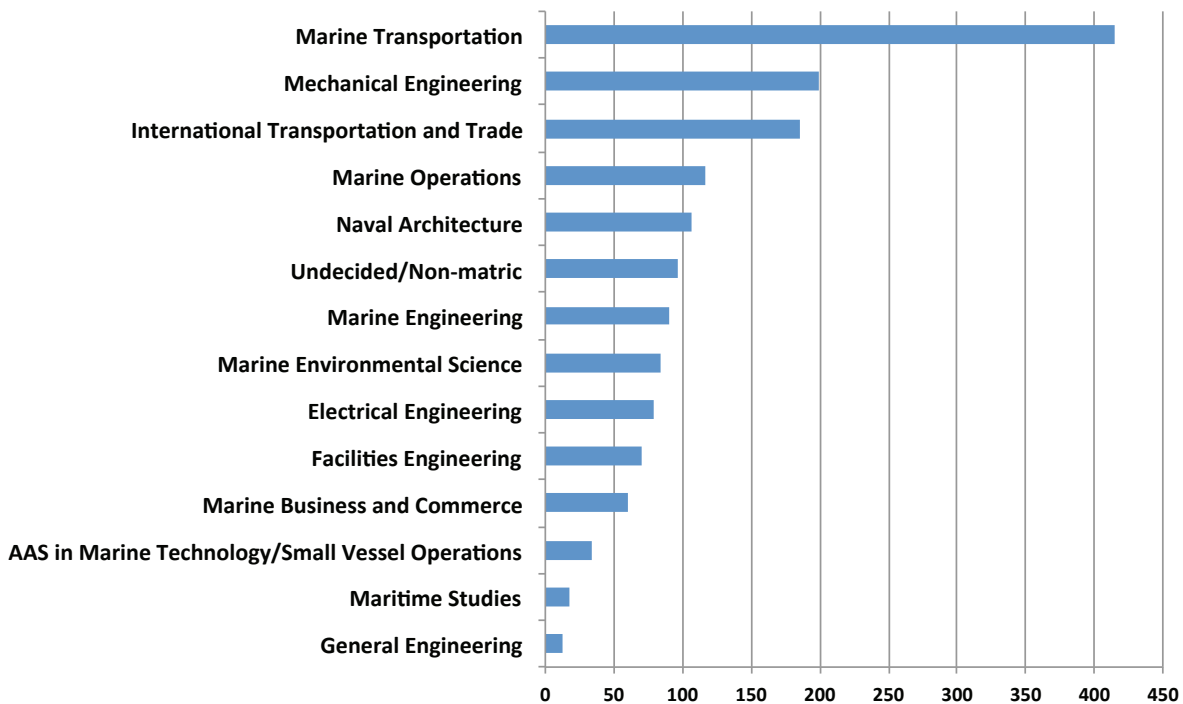

CAPITAL PROJECTS

The College's 2011-2012 fiscal year witnessed significant progress through a successfully executed capital program. The State University Construction Fund (SUCF) provided \$6.3 million to complete mission critical capital projects such as laboratory accreditation upgrades in the Science & Engineering Building, renovations in Riesenberg Gymnasium, Campus steam distribution replacement and a complete transformational overhaul of the Vander Clute Dining Facilities.

Capital construction continued on the New Academic Building, which is on schedule for a fall 2013 grand opening. Momentum has also continued on the deep water college pier and waterfront development, landscape enhancements, site lighting, classroom refurbishments, electrical upgrades and the replacement of the fire alarm in the Science and Engineering Building. Additionally, the Campus security system and various HVAC systems throughout the Campus were upgraded. During the 2011-2012 fiscal year, the College began a large scale solar thermal system installation to provide domestic hot water to all dorms as well as the Vander Clute Kitchen. The College has partnered with the New York Power Authority (NYPA) for the execution of this solar project, which when completed later this year, will be the largest solar thermal system on the east coast.

Several projects are currently in the pipeline. They include a new facilities warehouse, roof replacements on several buildings including the Fort and the Science and Engineering Buildings, an emergency generation system, and a comprehensive renovation of the central steam plant including a boiler replacement.



MARITIME ATHLETICS



The 2011-12 athletic season saw many teams continue their success from previous years:

- The Men's Soccer team set a program record with 14 wins and captured its second-straight Skyline Conference Championship in 2011. The Privateers automatically qualified for the field of 61 teams that made up the NCAA Tournament. It was the second time in program history the squad represented Maritime in the national playoffs.
- Men's Cross Country placed second at the 2011 Skyline Conference Championship Meet, marking the third-straight season the Privateers were the runners-up at the event.
- The Women's Cross Country team had its best finish at the Skyline Conference Championship Meet, finishing in third place at the event. The team has improved each year since being established in 2009.
- The Football team finished the 2011 season with an impressive 8-2 record, including a 6-1 mark in ECFC Conference action. The team had a seven-game winning streak that stretched nearly two months and came within one win of their second-straight conference championship. The Privateers finished the regular season with three votes in the National Coaches Poll.
- In February 2011, Men's Swimming captured its fifth consecutive Skyline Conference Championship after another fantastic year in the pool.
- The Men's Ice Hockey team had its best season in program history during the 2011-12 season. The Privateers reached the Championship Game of the Metropolitan Collegiate Hockey Conference after finishing the regular season as the No. 3 seed in the conference.
- Maritime Dinghy Sailing was ranked nationally in the Coaches Poll throughout the 2011-12 season. The squad qualified for and competed in the Inter-Collegiate Sailing Association National Championships in June in Austin, Texas.
- The Baseball team returned to the Skyline Tournament for the second time in three years after a sixth-place finish in the standings during the 2012 regular season.
- Members of the Maritime Offshore Sailing Team competed in the Newport-Bermuda Race in the Summer of 2012 aboard the Frers 45 yacht "Crazy Horse." It was the first time in over 30 years that members of the team took part in the prestigious race.

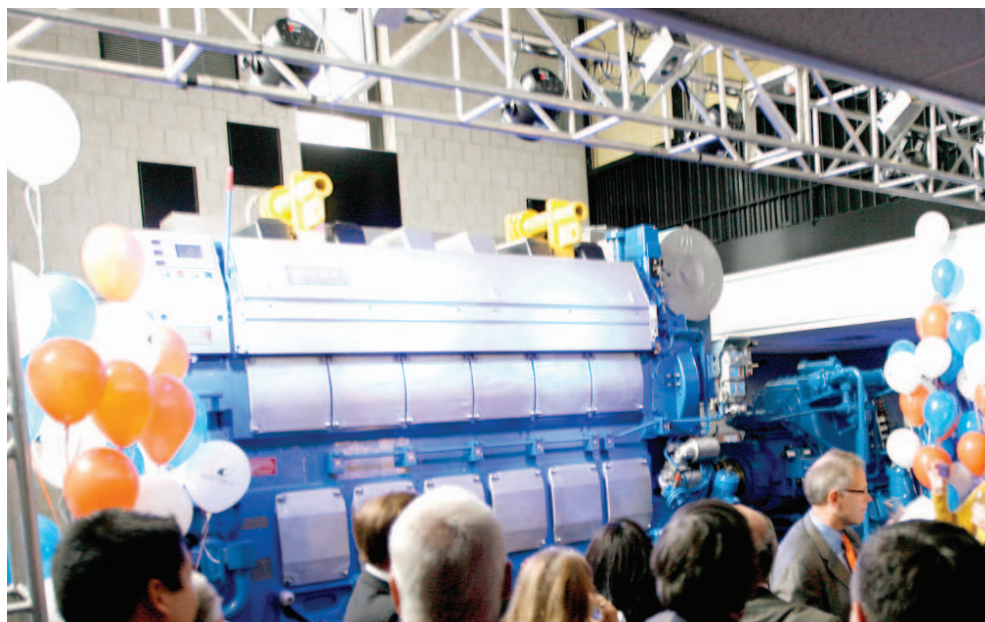

WÄRTSILÄ DIESEL ENGINE DONATION



Wärtsilä, a global leader in complete lifecycle power solutions for the marine and energy markets, based in Finland with US headquarter offices in Houston, TX, donated the main components of a hybrid diesel propulsion system to the College's Engineering Department. The diesel system was valued at \$1 million.

The donated equipment and support included a 6-cylinder Wärtsilä 26 medium speed diesel engine, reduction gear, a power take-in (motor) / take-out (generator), related system equipment, tools, instruction manuals and instruction, at Wärtsilä's Land and Sea Training Academy in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

The official dedication and opening of the Wärtsilä Lab, housed in Marvin Tode Hall, took place October 12, 2011. The next day, Wärtsilä and SUNY Maritime joined together and took part in the Closing Bell Ceremony at the NASDAQ stock exchange, Times Square in mid-town Manhattan. (See photo on following page.)

Commenting on the donation, Frank Donnelly, Managing Director, Wärtsilä North America, Inc. said, "We are thrilled to partner with SUNY Maritime College to help prepare the students for work in the maritime industry and particularly with diesel maritime technology."

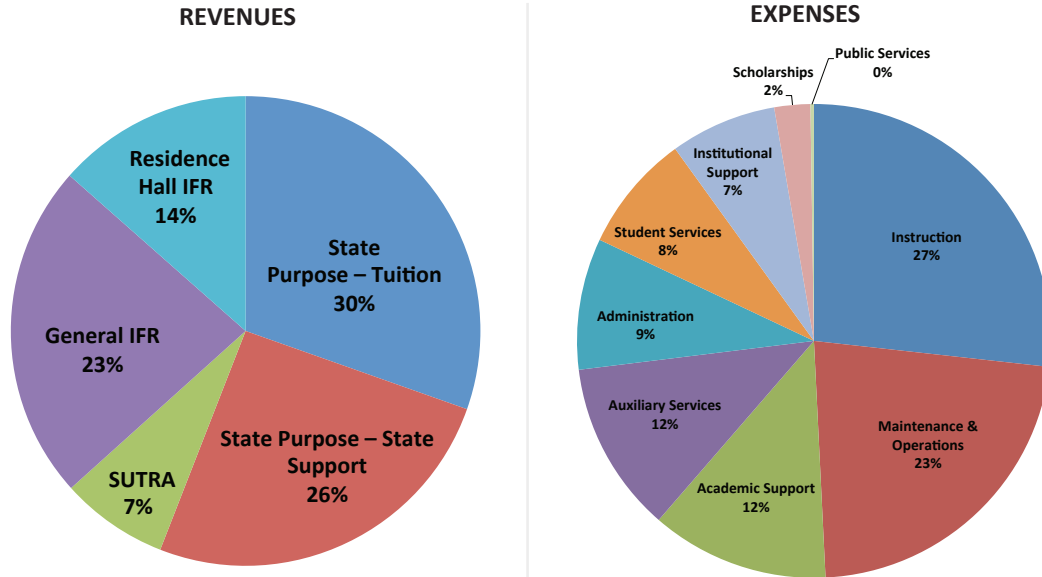

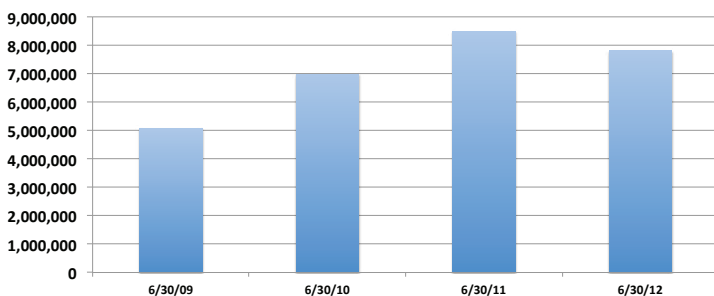
MARITIME COLLEGE ALL FUNDS BUDGET: \$37.8M



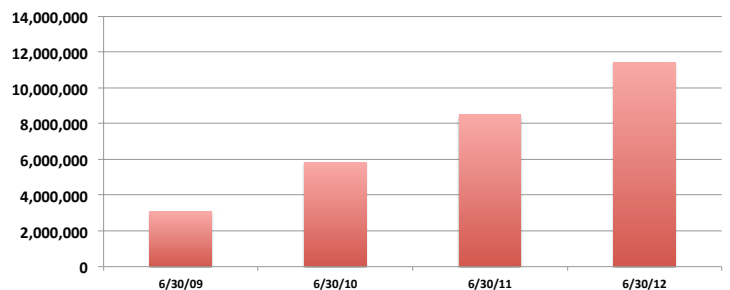

- Residence Hall IFR - The State University of New York residence halls are operated under the Income Fund Reimbursable (IFR) system that requires all operating costs, fringe benefits and debt service costs of the residence halls be funded from income generated by the Residence Hall operation. The College has the capacity to house over 1,200 students within four residence halls. Students occupy the rooms during the Fall and Spring semesters. Camps and conferences utilize the residence halls during the summer months.
- Income Fund Reimbursable (IFR’s) are self-sufficient accounts administered by the College.
- State University Tuition Reimbursement Account (SUTRA) is comprised of tuition and fee revenue from prior years that was collected in excess of the College’s enrollment targets, as well as Summer Ashore tuition revenue.

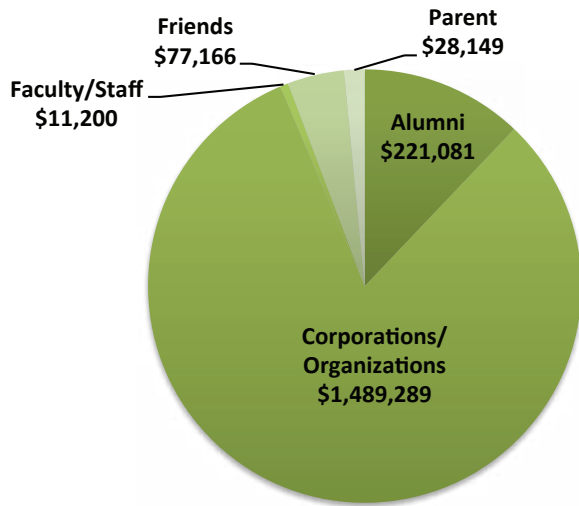
Residence Hall Financial Status

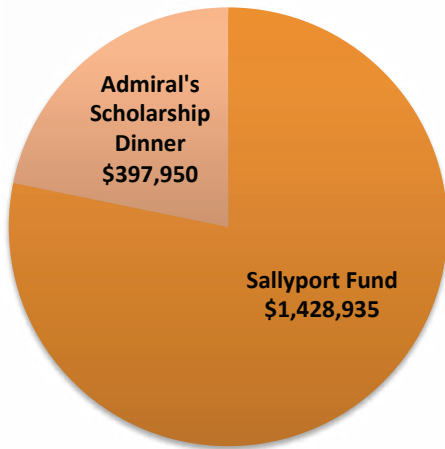

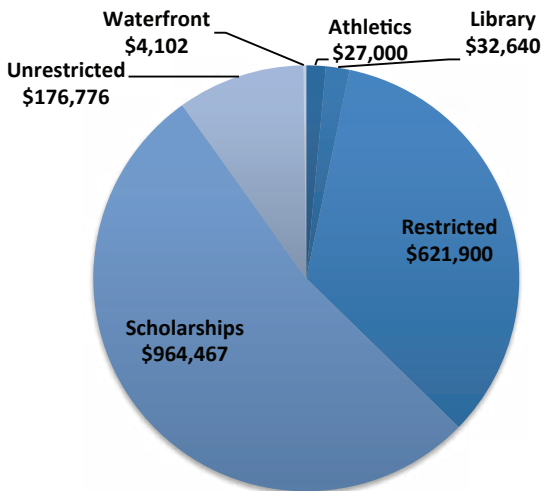

FACULTY PROFILES

Captain Walt Nadolny, '78

Professor Walt Nadolny, Class of '78, Vice Chair of the Marine Transportation Department, was awarded a \$325,000 grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation for Mariner Environmental Education. Over 18 months, Professor Nadolny designed and implemented an educational program to teach mariners aboard United States vessels about the environmental impact of chronic oil pollution. The focus was what mariners must do to comply with key environmental laws, and how to report violations to the United States Coast Guard, as well as State and Local Environmental enforcement officials. A web site and application for GPS enabled smart phones now allows real-time documentation of pollution

events. The research also examined the effects of oil pollution on the coastal waters of New York and New Jersey. A professional video documented his work. Professor Nadolny delivered his findings to high school students, recreational boaters, professional mariners on commercial coastal and harbor craft as well deep draft vessel operators. Both graduate and undergraduate students assisted him in his work and supported his research and outreach to the various communities. A full-time faculty member of the Marine Transportation Department, he is also a member of the steering committee of the Environmental Consortium of Hudson Valley Colleges & Universities.

Captain Eric Johansson, Professor of Professional Education and Training, was appointed by U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security, Janet Napolitano, to the Towing Safety Advisory Committee (TSAC). This Committee was established in accordance with and operates under the provisions of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA) and acts solely in an advisory capacity to the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) on matters relating to shallow-draft

inland and coastal waterway navigation and towing safety.

Captain Johansson is the founder of the annual SUNY Maritime College Towing Forum, held each fall at the College. He has taught at Maritime College since 1994, holds a Master of Science in International Transportation Management from SUNY Maritime College and is recognized nationally for his expertise in the Towing Industry.
